A LETTER FROM: Mrs. Ray V. Jared, 5 April 1952:

“Now we thought we had struck the Jack-pot when my husband’s second cousin, John W. Jarrett, Little Rock, Arkansas, found in a Kentucky attic an old ledger of John Jared’s ‘situate on his plantation in the 4th division of the 3rd Survey in District of Virginia.’ Entries were from 1772-1780 by John, then his last entry 1805. Later his son Joel Jared, R.V.’s ancestor, one-half brother to your William, took it and used it until 1831.

“John in his own handwriting left this record: ‘John Jared, son of Thomas and Martha, his wife, was born 25 June 1737.’ Also Perrins “History of Kentucky” page 1065 says: ‘John Jarrett born 1737, wagon maker, son of Thomas and Martha Jarrett, English descent.’

“Hannah, his wife, your Miss Whitaker, was born 21 September 1739, married 28 Aug.---, (no year).

“William Jared was born 3 June 1758, Joseph Jared was born 2 January 1760; Naomi Jared was born 9 August 1763.

“Hannah, wife of John, was daughter of John Whitaire (not Whitaker) and Naomi his wife. She died 8 November 1765. Then he gives second marriage 1767 to Rachel --, 18 years old, but all records of her last name is blotted out. Can we be sure it is Palmer?

I (Eleanor Hall) wrote to this most helpful cousin in Little Rock. His record seemed to tie in perfectly. Here was a wagonmaker writing his name both Jared and Jarrett; his children had the right names and ages. Could the wife’s name, Whitaire, be really Whitacre – was what appeared to be an “i” really a “c” making a name that would be pronounced Whitaker,” to make my great grandmother’s story correct? Would he examine the hand writing minutely for this clue to a name?

I received the following letter 27 September 1952:

It seems apparent that all the “cousin,” “descendants of John Jared of Bedford County, Virginia, would make quite an army of WAC’s and GI’s. I have so far been in contact with only the descendants of John’s youngest son, Joel, born in 1785, who was my great grandfather. John and Joel each had twelve children and surely the “CLAN” comprising John’s progeny would furnish the population for a good sized county.

As you will notice from the enclosed list showing my descent, my father died when I was only eight years of age. My mother went back to her own people to live with her two children, myself and an older sister, who is Mrs. John Gibson living at Hardinsburgh, KY. I grew up among my mother's people and knew very little of my father's family. While on a visit to my sister in 1950, I discovered that she had acquired an old account book which none of us had known about. It was found in an apartment in Louisville that had been occupied by our Aunt Louisa Smith, sister of my father, until her death in 1940. At my sister's insistence, I brought it home with me.

The book is very fragile, ready to fall to pieces, and is also fragmentary. (At least half the sheets have been cut out and many pieces of pages have been sliced out, probably for us in writing receipts, notes, and similar instruments. The entries are not in chronological order, but seem to have been entered from time to time wherever a blank space was available.) The earliest entry (still in the book) was made in October 1772, and the latest in 1831. At the bottom of the first page is the following notation, "John Jared, his book, Bedford County 1803, page 16." At the top of a subsequent page appears "john Jared his account book 1805." No accounts in the name of John Jared appear after the 1790's and the accounts of Joel Jarred begin in 1812, or earlier, and continue to 1831. Only one notation made later than Joel Jarred's accounts appear in the book. It reads "Wilson Jarrett January the 28th 1857, and was born the 29th of August in the year of our Lord 1810."

The various accounts show that John Jared was a wood worker making wagons, wagon wheels, spinning wheels, and looms, and such other implements as pioneers used in those days. It seems that he also operated a distillery for a time in the "Fourth division of the Third Survey in the District of Virginia.

I am enclosing a copy of the page showing the family record, a copy of an entire page on which the name Whitacre (or Whitaire) appears three times, and a copy of an account with William Jared which I think will be of interest to you.

The media Research Bureau, Washington, D.C. list fourteen different spellings of the name in England and America. From my description of the account book you will notice that the name in this one family is spelled three ways. Our English and early Virginia ancestors were not especially good at spelling. In the records of the Virginia Company Sir Edwin Sandys, the Secretary, spells his own name two different ways. The pioneer Americans wrote a fine hand, but did not spell names correctly. But it is evident that a large number of Jared's, Jarred's and Jarrett's are descended from John of Bedford County.

The old journal extracts prove our genealogical connections to be solidly made.

- *Note: Joel Jarred/Jared was born 19 July 1785, died 10 December 1872 at the age of 87 years. He was the twelfth child and sixth son of John Jared the wagonmaker. His mother was John's second wife, Rachel Palmer Jared. He married Polly Dowell, daughter of Macajah and Frances Dowell, born 15 July 1787.*
- *Ada Matheny of Yale, Illinois, has the old family Bible which once belonged to Joel and Polly Dowell Jared. The history of the Bible is given on its flyleaf as follows:*

(Publication date not given.)

"Handed down to me October 1895 by Aunt Katy Vanderhoff – A.K. Watt, Newton, IL

"From Mother to Delia 1922"

"From Delia (Cordelia) to Ada Matheny, her daughter."

The family record is apparently written by Polly Dowell Jared:

"Joel Jared and Polly Dowell were married in Bedford Co., state of Virginia in the year of our Lord 1805 and moved to Breckenridge County, Kentucky in the fall of 1806, where we continued to live till this present day, it being the 21st day of Feb. 1836."

The family record follows with births, marriages and deaths, all in Polly's handwriting. Then in another handwriting we find:

“Joel Jared son of John and Rachel Jared was born 19th July 1785.

“Joel Jared died the 10th day of Dec. 1872. His age 87.”

“Polly Jared daughter of Micajah Dowell and Frances his wife was born the 15th of July 1787, died the 12th day of June 1860 her age was 73.”

In 1852 Polly and Joel with their family moved to Illinois where they united with the Bethel Congregation of Cumberland Presbyterian Church. She lived to see all her children and some of her grandchildren become members of the Church. She was one of the practical Christians who believed in doing the work and by works her faith was made perfect.

- *Notes on this page:*
The last entry is in a different handwriting and with ink that has faded more than the entries on the upper part of the page.
- *The words "was born" after the name of Hannah Jared is marked out in the same ink in which it was written.*
- *The year "1739" showing the year of birth of Hannah Jared first wife of John Jared has written over it in different ink "1855" and under it the result of a subtraction 116. Its meaning is most uncertain as she is reported as having died November 8 1765.*

(This is the last page in the old account book. All the remaining pages are gone and apparently more than half of the book had been cut out.)

This account continues through June and shows a total of gallons distilled 112 0 1, and about 36 entries in the column showing the amounts disposed of. A number of the remaining names are faded until they are illegible.

Proof of Ancestors Service:

John Jared, sometimes recorded as John Jarrett, had two sons, William and Joseph who served in the Revolutionary War.

It is known that John lived in Loudoun and Bedford Counties of Virginia during the period of the Revolutionary War.

An old account book of John Jared was found in an attic of the apartment of one of his descendants in Louisville, Kentucky, in 1940. This book is now in the possession of John W. Jarrett, Little Rock, Arkansas. On the first existing page it clearly states "John Jared, His Book."

The ledger is badly worn with about half of the pages cut out and in it John Jared, states that he was the son of Thomas and Marha Jared and gives the names of his wives and also his children's names and dates of birth.

The accounts are not entered chronologically but wherever a blank space was available, and the entries that are still intact cover the period from 1772 to 1831.

Entries from 1780 to 1786 show payments made to his son William Jared. In the year 1781 it states "By work done by him at I went to camp." In 1782 "by 'garding' the prisoners at Winchester." This probably gave the father John Jared a chance to go home for a while.

The next entry is in the same vein. "13 April, 1783, By helping with the wagon to Bedford and working there that summer and helping us move the family in." This was probably the date 1783 the family of John Jared moved from Loudoun Co. to Bedford Co., Virginia.

The prisoners at Winchester which John guarded were evidently a part or all of Cornwallis Army.

Book of Jared Vol. 3 by Eleanor Hall – pg. 238

J.W. Jarrett, Little Rock, Ark. to his sister July 20, 1950.

"Dear sister,

"Since I came home I have copied some of the most interesting accounts and pages in the Old Account Book, and am sending you copies as I believe they will be of interest to you. The book is so fragmentry, frayed and worn that it is hard to find accounts that are entire and therefore logical. I have copied entries that seemed to throw light on the early history and way of life of the family. The book carries the record back about two generations further than anything yet known, giving the birthdate of Joel Jarred and his father John Jared as well as the given names of the grandfather and grandmother. The home location was evidently Bedford County, Virginia, but place names are scarce. Nothing in the book indicate when the family, or any member of it moved to Kentucky, but it was probably around 1805 or 1806."

From a letter to Raymond R. Jared 14217 Forrer, Detroit, Michigan from J.W. Jarrett Jonesboro, Ark. date 13 August 1935.

"The oldest son of Joel Jarrett, Mason, settled at Clifton Mills, Kentucky where he reared a large family, none of whom I ever knew although I grew up within fifteen miles of them.

"Your grandfather, Israel Jarrett, seems to have moved to Illinois where he also reared a large family. Allen went to Florida where he was killed in a duel. One of the daughters married a Mr. Clemons in the southern part of Breckinridge Co., and her granddaughter is the wife of Henry Cary of Tulsa, Okla., a brother of my wife, who was Miss Jessie Cary of Glendean, Kentucky.

"I am the grandson of Wilson Jarrett and Catherine Dowell who settled at Stephensport, KY in the first half of the nineteenth century. Wilson Jarrett also reared a large family of whom my father, William Hunter Jarrett, was the second son born in 1840. He died in 1887 when I was only eight years of age, leaving my mother with two children, a daughter Ida Hester Jarrett, born May 23, 1877,

and myself, born October 26, 1879, and consequently we grew up among her people.

“My father was a member of the Kentucky Orphan Brigade in the Southern Army, while his older brother, Samuel, and younger brother, John Wesley, for whom I was named, were officers in the Union Army. After the Civil War Samuel Jarrett settled at Olney, Illinois where he died in 1923, leaving a widow and four daughters.

“My father’s brother, John Wesley Jarrett, was an attorney in Breckenridge Co., KY until about the year 1900 when he removed to Dallas, Texas to be with his only son, Grover C. Jarred, and died there about 1920.

“The only one of my father’s sisters that I ever knew was Mrs. Lousia Smith, who died in Louisville, KY in 1932 at the age of about 85, leaving one daughter, Miss Maud Smith, who now lives at 45047 S. 3rd St. in Louisville, and is a teacher in Public Schools.”
