*Captain William Jared, s/o John & Hannah Whitacre married Elizabeth Raulsten, their son Moses Jared, and his descendants fit into a story involving the Mormon's.*

*Moses Jared married Malinda Byrne, they settled in the 16<sup>th</sup> Judicial District near the town of Buffalo Valley in the hills of Putnam County. Moses died at the age of thirty-three years and left the 27-year-old Malinda to provide for their four children alone. She lived a widow for fifty-four years, managed her farm and her affairs and raised her children well. Malinda was a daughter of William & Rhoda (England) Byrne. Malinda Byrne was the sister of Dorcas Byrne who married Joseph Jared. Joseph Jared was the brother of Moses Jared. Malinda Byrne was also the sister of Lawrence Byrne who married Martha “Patsy” Jared sister of Moses & Joseph Jared.*

*Many of the children of William & Rhoda (England) Byrne are intermarried with those of the Jared family. William Byrne was born 1768 in Dublin, Ireland. He had two brothers, Daniel and Alexander. He came to America when quite young. He married in 1796 Rhoda England, daughter of John and Jane (Grant) England. She was born 2 October 1773 in White Co., TN. They were married in Burke Co., NC. She lived to the age of 104 years. Everyone called her “Granny Byrne.” William died 23 December 1823. James Polk Byrne told his daughter, Margaret, that his grandfather William Byrne was born in County Wicklow, Ireland, and that their name originally was O’Byrne.*

Their daughter Rhoda Byrne Jared married Adolphia Young in Jackson County, TN, 26 July 1836. Adolphia Young was the son of John Young & Matilda Gibson. John’s brother was David Young who married Elizabeth Vance. Their parents were William Young & Elizabeth Huff. Adolphia and his family lived in Jackson County until the spring of 1842 when they heard the Gospel of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. In the fall of 1843 they moved to Nauvoo, IL and remained there until the spring of ‘46, then they went with the church to Council Bluffs. \*See story Rhoda Byrne Jared.

*Aldophia & Rhoda (Byrne) Jared's daughter Frances Gibson Jared married Brigham Hamilton Young, a nephew of the Prophet Brigham Young. These two Young families are not related. Rhoda's sister Anna Ross Young married Robert Stone Duke. Anna remembers when her family was living in the cellar of John Doyle Lee's house in Nauvoo, IL, when the news of Prophet Joseph & Hyrum Young being murdered happen. \*See Anna Ross Young*

*Aldophia & Rhoda had another daughter named Martha Vance Jared, she married John Duke. John's parents were involved with the Mormon church. \*See John Duke story. One of their daughters, Rhoda Frances Duke married Charles Alma Moulton. From the Book of Jared is a story about them on page 90. Rhoda Frances Duke, b. 28 April 1861, Provo, UT – d. 21 February 1928; md 28 July 1879 to Charles Alma Moulton, b. 6 May 1856 at sea, in the English Channel, d. 5 May 1931, Rexburg, Idaho, s/o Thomas & Sarah (Denton) Moulton from Leicester, England.*

*The Moultons' moved to Teton Basin, Idaho in July 1896. They settled on a homestead in Chapin, Idaho. Rhoda was a kind and loving mother, a help to the neighbors in times of sickness and trouble. Born of goodly parents, who as children with their parents, were driven by mobs from their homes in Nauvoo, IL. They remembered and often told the story of the miracle of the quails. It was in 1846, when the Saints were driven from their homes in the winter. They crossed the Mississippi River on ice and camped in the snow on the Iowa side. Faced with death from starvation and exposure, the Mormons were saved by great flocks of wild quail alighting in the camp on the beds, in the wagons and within reach of the famished who quickly prepared and devoured them. They came day after day until sustenance could be provided in a normal way. They had eleven children.*

*Several of their sons left for Wyoming. The story on page 93, The Book of Jared states; Sometime in the year 1908 Thomas Alma, John Alfred, & Joseph Wallace Moulton came from their home in Chapin, Idaho, to Jackson Hole, Wyoming, and homesteaded at Grovont, Wyoming, better known as "Mormon Row". They each took 160 acres of good black, level land at the north end of "Mormon Row".*

*In April 1913 Thomas Alma Moulton brought his wife Lucile Blanchard, d/o John Johnson & Elizabeth (Fife) Blanchard, and their son Clark Alma Moulton to live on the homestead. The only irrigation water close by ran dry in July, so work was started on a canal when a land slide, followed by a flood washed away about two miles of the work. Then, almost as a miracle, a warm spring came out of the mountain lower down, large enough to water several ranches. Now the land produced abundantly. The ranch was owned by Thomas sons and later sold to the National Park Service in 1960.*

*Aldophia & Rhoda Byrne (Jared) Young's only son to live to maturity was Brigham Lawrence Young. He was not related to the great Mormon leader and prophet, Brigham Young, but he did receive his first name from that man. Brigham Lawrence Young was the only male member of the household of Aldophia & Rhoda to survive the trek and the early persecutions of the Mormon community. He was just four years old when he entered Salt Lake City, UT with his parents and five sisters. He could remember taking willows and brushing crickets into the irrigation ditches when those pests invaded the crops of the Utah pioneers and how relieved he was to realize the help of the seagulls that came from the island of the Great Salt Lake to devour the crickets and save their food. \* See Brigham Lawrence Young.*

*The woman who compiled The Book of Jared was Eleanor McAllister Hall. She fits in as follows: Brigham Lawrence Young married Ida Francel Lewis. She was born 8 February 1858 in Parowan, UT, a daughter of James & Emily J. (Holman) Lewis. They had eight children. One of their daughters Ida Young, b. 26 November 1881, Kanab, married, 10 June 1903, in the Salt Lake Temple, Richard Samuel "Dick" McAllister, b. 27 October 1874, St. George, UT, s/o William James Frazier & Eleanor Jackson (Adams) McAllister. Richard d. 20 November 1950. Ida died, 15 August 1955, services held in the Kanab Ward Church. They had twelve children. She also raised two daughters of her husband by his previous marriage. Richard was bishop of Kanab Ward for seven years. She and her husband were called from Kanab Stake as missionaries to the St. George Temple. They served as ordinance workers for ten years. She was called to be matron of the temple. She was preceded in death by two children, Lawrence Dale, and Luetta McAllister Hall, and her husband.*

*When Richard Samuel "Dick" McAllister was two years old his family moved to Kanab, UT. He married 19 November 1895 Harriet Luetta "Toot" Brown in the St. George Temple. They had two children, Elma and Beulah. "Toot" died and Dick's mother cared for his children while he filled an L.D.S. mission to Arkansas. On 10 June 1900, he married Ida Young in the Salt Lake Temple. "Dick" was active throughout his entire life in the L.D.S. Church and for eight years was a member of the Kanab Stake High Council. He was Bishop of the Kanab Ward for seven years, during which time he supervised and managed the building of the Kanab Ward chapel, later known as the Kanab North Ward chapel. In 1932 Dick and Ida were called as missionaries to the St. George Temple and served for ten years. Dick was an actor and entertainer in the days when home theaters served as entertainment. He usually took comedian parts and many of his humorous interpretations are quoted today. He made his living by farming and cattle raising and working seasonal jobs. In his youth he loved to break horses. He could tame a little pony from the wild bands of AZ or gentle a highly bred Percheron and teach it to work in a team for the Sunday surry. At different times he served as a member of the Town Council, Water master, a member of the governing water board and as town marshal. They made their home in St. George, UT from 1932 – 1949. They returned to Kanab, IL where both died and are buried.*

*Two of the daughters of Richard Samuel “Dick” & Ida (Young) McAllister; Luetta McAllister and Eleanor McAllister married the same man; Henry Vernon Hall.*

*Luetta McAllister, b. 30 March 1904 – d. 3 September 1933, traffic accident, married Henry Vernon Hall, b. 4 April 1900, Rockville, UT, s/o Alfred Lorenzo & Julia Elzina (Hansen) Hall. They had two children; Howard Gallatin Hall – b. 6 February 1928, Bozeman, MT, married Raona Richard, b. 30 June 1930, to Ralph Ashton & Ida (Lany) Richards; and Charles McAllister, b. 21 November 1930, Mountain View, Vinta, WY, who married 11 October 1957, Frankie Jane Taylor, b. 13 October 1938 to Charles Frank & Helen (Chatwin) Taylor. After Luetta’s death, Henry Vernon Hall married Luetta’s sister, Eleanor McAllister. Eleanor raised her sister, Luetta’s children. Eleanor writes a wonderful story about her sister, Luetta McAllister on pgs. 65-68 in the Book of Jared, Vol. 3.*

*Eleanor McAllister, b. 24 May 1910, Kanab, UT – d. 17 November 2000. Graduate Dixie College 1933, teacher and professional genealogist; md 27 November 1933, Henry Vernon Hall. Hobbies: landscaping, painting, poetry writing and ancestor hunting. Favorite people - Relatives. Pg. 142, The Book of Jared, by Eleanor M. Hall.*

*Eleanor (McAllister) Hall, compiled and dedicated ‘The Book of Jared’ in memory of her Great Grandparents, Adophia & Rhoda Byrne (Jared) Young. Rhoda Byrne was the d/o Moses & Malinda (Byrne) Jared. Moses was the s/o William & Elizabeth (Raulston) Jared. William being the s/o John Jared the wagonmaker. *While going through some old papers belonging to my Grandparents Virgil Timothy & Audra Camilla (Anderson) Denny I found a land grant for 2 ½ acres in the first district, White Co., TN. The assignee was William P. Anderson. The grant states: THERE IS GRANTED BY THE SAID STATE OF TENNESSEE UNTO David Young assignee of the said William P. Anderson.*

*\*See Grant – David Adolphous Young*

*David Adolphous Young son of William Young & Elizabeth Huff, brother of John Young, was involved with the Mormon's as the following story goes. John Doyle Lee, a Mormon preacher who came through middle Tennessee on a mission in the early 1840's conducted debates and revivals in the Putnam-Jackson-Smith county area, and converted several people, among them David Young and his family. David was not only a farmer, but also a carpenter and gunsmith. These were valuable skills to the rapidly-growing Mormon community, and he was persuaded to move to Nauvoo, Illinois. In the summer of 1846 as the Saints were being forced to abandon Nauvoo, David and his family with hundreds and thousands of other, made the trek across southern Iowa. The hardships of the journey, coupled with adverse weather, caused much suffering and illness. There was a good deal of rain and people became ill with malaria, bronchitis, pneumonia, and other related ailments. Many people died on the way and were buried in little cemeteries along the trail. Winter Quarters was established at Kaneshville on the Missouri River, later to be called Council Bluffs. David, his wife, and son died during the winter of 1846-47 and are buried in Fair View Cemetery in Council Bluffs. The two daughters, Mary and Lavina, became the ninth and tenth wives of John Doyle Lee, their sponsor, and went on to Utah where they raised their families. \*See John Doyle Lee, by Thelma C. *The Book of Jared, pg. 279 shows a letter from Elizabeth (Raulsten) Jared to Jane (Simmons) Raulsten, her sister giving the circumstances of the death of Martha "Patsy" Jared.*

*Dear Sister,*

*I avail myself of this opportunity of writing to you that you may once more hear the language of your old friend and associate for I never expect to see you again unless you visit your old settlement for I am utterly unable to travel any distance but thee hope to see you and brother James sometime and would be glad to hear from you often as I am deprived of your company.*

*I am in tolerable health at present. I must here relate the death of Patsy Byrne who took her departure, on the 10<sup>th</sup> of last month. She left home about seven weeks before she died and came here on horseback but was very much fatigued when she arrived and gradually grew weaker until the period of her dissolution. She expressed the strongest confidence in God until the last and gently sank to rest in the arms of the dear Redeemer. You must know something of the trouble I feel which is inexpressable but it is much appeased when I contemplate the happy time when my children shall all, with all the followers of Immanuel be restored again to their patents where parting shall be no more.*

*Yours affectionately until death  
Elizabeth Jared*

*I (Audrey June (Denny) Lambert) fit in to all of this by being a descendant of Capt. William Jared & Elizabeth Raulston and their son Joseph Jared who married his second wife Rachel Rhea Ray after Dorcas Bryne died. Joseph Jared being the brother of Moses Jared who married Malinda Byrne. Moses & Malinda's daughter Rhoda B. Jared marrying Adolphia Young. Adolphia being the son of John Young who was the brother of Mark & David Young. Mark Young having marrying Ruth Raulston who was the sister of Elizabeth Raulston who married Capt. William Jared. David Young who married Elizabeth Vance whose daughters Mary Vance "Polly" Young & Lavina Young married John Doyle Lee. What started my search on this line of the family was the discovery of the land grant to David Young by the assignee of the said William P. Anderson. I am researching the connection of William P. Anderson at this time.*

*Joseph Jared married Dorcas Byrne sister of Malinda Byrne. Joseph & Dorcas Byrne were married for nine years before she died in 1803. Joseph then married, 2<sup>nd</sup> 21 August 1834, Hunt, TX, Rachel Rhea Ray. \* See Jared – Shanks line, \*See Young – Jared line, \*See John Jared – Geraldine Denny line, \* See John Jared – Tim Denny line.*
