*Moses settled in the 16<sup>th</sup> Judicial District near the town of Buffalo Valley in the hills of Putnam Co., Tennessee. Lecil Nichols now farms on their old land grant. He is a great grandson of Moses and Malinda. From the Putnam Co., family records in the Nashville Public Library we find this account: "Cedar Bluff Farm is on Big Indian Creek, Putnam county, located three miles east of Buffalo Valley, Tennessee. Five generations have been raised on this farm."*

*The old Moses Jared Family Bible was burned when the original house burned to the ground, but there seems to be several copies of a statement of Malinda Byrne about her family. One was placed in the Nashville library in 1936 by Alice Loftus, and states:*

*“William Jared, son of Moses and Malinda Jared was born on Saturday, may 22, 1819, deceased the same day and date. Rhoda Jared, daughter of Moses and Malinda Jared was born Tuesday, October 24, 1820. Betsy Ann was born Thursday 13 August 1822. Mary Ann was born 13 August 1824. Emily born Friday 3 August 1827.*

*“Statement to children—Malinda Jared the daughter of William and Rhoda Byrne was born in Kingston, East Tennessee. Married to Moses Jared the son of William and Betsy Jared in Middle Tennessee 3 may 1817. Professed Religion 1819. Raised four children, all living, the youngest day fifty-three years old. On the same farm sixty-two years. This day I am eight years old.”*

*Moses Jared died at the age of thirty-three years and left the 27-year-old Malinda to provide for their four children alone. She lived a widow for fifty-four years, managed her farm and her affairs and raised her children well. They married into the best families of the county and when I visited Tennessee in 1951 and inquired where to find some of the descendants, I was told along with the directions, “you will be proud of them.” Story – Book of Jared – pg. 26.*

*Moses Alexander Jared was born four months after the death of his father and as a result superstition grew up around him. It was believed that he had supernatural powers of healing and even after he was a old man, people would bring their babies to him if they had "Coated Tongue," or "Thrash," or a sore throat. They would ask him to blow in the baby's mouth to cure its ailment.*

*Moses Alexander Jared was the father of twenty children, thirteen by his first wife and seven by his second. On August 3, 1961, his 134<sup>th</sup> birthday anniversary, he had four children still very much alive and active. They were May Taylor, living with her son, Re. Jared Taylor in California, Missouri; Mark Anthony and Newton Jasper Jared living in Springfield, Missouri; and Mrs. Betsy Ann Cox living at West Plains, Missouri.*

*Oscar King Holladay served two terms in the State Senate and was elected judge of the Fifth Judicial Circuit of Tennessee. Thompson Luther Denny, father of Marguerite "Maggie" Denny was the son of Jonothan & Agnes (Thompson) Denny. Jonothan Denny was the son of Zachariah & Catherine Stallings, Stallins. Zachariah Denny was also the father of Timothy Denny who married Elizabeth Hettie Paul. Timothy & Elizabeth were the great grandparent of Audrey June (Denny) Lambert.*

*Joseph & Moses were brothers, their parents were Capt. William & Elizabeth (Raulston) Jared. Malinda (Byrne) Jared was the sister of Dorca Byrne who married Joseph Jared. Their parents were William & Rhoda (England) Byrne*

*Many of the children of William Byrne are intermarried with those of the Jared family. William Byrne was born 1768 in Dublin, Ireland. He had two brothers, Daniel and Alexander. He came to America when quite young. He married in 1796 Rhoda England, d/o John and Jane (Grant) England. She was born 2 October 1773 in White co., TN. They were married in Burke Co., NC. She lived to the age of 104 years. Everyone called her "Granny Byrne." He died 23 December 1823. Children: Bryce Collins, Lawrence, Malinda, Alexander, Dorcas, Miriam & William Jr. Byrne.*

*James Polk told his daughter, Margaret, that his grandfather, William Byrne, was born in County Wicklow, Ireland, and that their name originally was O'Byrne.*

*Jonathan Lasley Ensor was from Bristol, Tennessee. He came down South after leaving home as a young man. Sixteen miles down Walton Road, (now highway 70) at Low Gap, Ruth Jared lived in the home of her parents. There was no school near, and little social life where young folks participated. She wondered what her fate would be. One night she dreamed she dreamed she saw a young man riding a bay horse. He had beautiful, penetrating blue eyes and was wearing a brown jean suit. A few days, later, when Joathan Ensor knocked at the Jared door, Ruth recognized him immediately. They were married. Story from The Book of Jared by Eleanor Hall – pg. 537.*

*Jonathan Lasley Ensor came from Washington County to settle in the lower end of Putnam County near the Low Gap about 1820. He married Ruth Jared, youngest daughter of Joseph Jared and his first wife, Agnes Beard Jared. They were members of Pleasant Grove Methodist Church in Rock Spring Valley. He was the father of: Capt. William Asbury Ensor, Emiline Ensor, married John Holladay, and Martha Ensor married William Tate; and the grandfather of: Jonathan Lasley Ensor, Isaac Monroe Ensor, Virginia Carr Ensor, Dr. Lorenzo Dow Jared Ensor, Louvina Ensor, Emma Avo Ensor "Emmie," Tennessee Frances Ensor, and William Wirt Ensor. – Pictorial History of Putnam Co., Tennessee – pg. 18*
