TO PROBE, WOMAN'S DEATH TO 'SATISFY' BROTHER, SISTER
Coroner Dow Will Conduct Autopsy of Mrs. Burton At Silver Point

MURDER IS NOT HINTED

County coroner, J. J. B. Dow was to conduct the examination this afternoon of the body of Mrs. L. D. Burton, 58, who died suddenly at her home in Silver Point, March 10, just four days before her husband died of pneumonia.

E. Y. Jared, of Buffalo Valley, a brother of Mrs. Burton, told the Herald that he had asked the body be exhumed to "satisfy" him and another sister, Ulzo Jared, of the Eleventh District.

He said Mrs. Burton dropped dead March 10 of what statistical records here state as simply "heart failure." Mr. Jared said he had never heard of Mrs. Burton's having heart disease, nor was he aware of her being ill.

F. U. Foster, professor of chemistry at Tennessee Tech, will analyze the vital organs of Mrs. Burton.

'Just to Know'

Asked if he and his sister suspected foul play to the death of Mrs. Burton, Mr. Jared replied that they were "not satisfied: We just want to know what killed her."

He was told that the exhumation would lead to the natural presumption that they felt Mrs. Burton had been given poison, but he would make no further comment. He said so far as he knew Mrs. Burton was a normal and healthy woman.

Mr. and Mrs. Burton moved to Silver Point early this year from Wilson county, where they had resided for the past eleven or twelve years. Mr. Burton had willed his wife his entire estate, including a farm of 147 acres in Wilson county, it was reported here. Mr. Burton's health failed while he lived near Lebanon, and he removed to Silver Point, his former home. He was stricken with pneumonia in March and died a few days later.

The body will be exhumed at Silver Point, and the chemical analysis will be made in Mr. Foster's laboratories at Tech.

It was said here that Mr. Burton was worth between \$13,000 and \$15,000.

Mrs. Burton Died of Natural Causes

Mrs. L. D. Burton of Silver Point who died suddenly at her home March 10 was declared a victim of natural death by physicians who performed an autopsy on her body Thursday at the request of her brother, B. Y. Jared of Buffalo Valley.

The body was exhumed under direction of County Coroner J. B. Dow and Dr. Millis of Baxter, County Health officer. An exam showed that Mrs. Burton died of a ruptured heart wall.

Relatives of Mrs. Burton's husband, who died 4 days after her death, were anxious that the autopsy be performed to clear any doubts as to the manner of her death.

SILVER POINT: Mrs. L. D. Burton, 59, fell dead at her home Friday March 10 at 1:00 from a heart attack. Wednesday March 15 at 2:00 Mr. Burton died with double pneumonia after several days illness. Funeral services were held for Mrs. Burton Sunday March 12 at the home by Bro. Tallman of Cookeville. Interment took place in the family cemetery.

Mrs. Burton was before her marriage, Miss Etmo Jared and a very prominent school teacher. Surviving her are her mother, Mrs. Eado Jared, 1 sister, Miss Ulzo Jared, and 1 brother, E. Y. Jared. She was a member of the Church of Christ.

Mr. Burton was 59 years of age. Bro. Tallman held the services at the Church of Christ of which Mr. Burton was a member. The remains were laid to rest beside Mrs. Burton. He is survived by his mother, Mrs. Amanda Green (Puckett) Burton, 1 sister, Mrs. Albert (Minnie) Ashburn, 3 brothers, M. B., N. C., and W. B. Burton. The families of both Mr. and Mrs. Burton have the sympathy of the entire community.

Funeral services for E. Y. Jared, 74, familiarly known as "B" Jared, who died Monday at his home in Buffalo Valley after a brief illness, were conducted Tuesday at the Buffalo Valley Church of Christ.

One of the county's most successful farmers, Mr. Jared was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Josiah Jared and was a grandson of John Jared who was a pioneer of Putnam County.
