

**Isaac Claiborn Jared Obt.**

b. 19 April 1882 – d. 20 November 1974.

Funeral services for Isaac Claiborn Jared, 92, were conducted from the Chapel of Hooper-Huddleston Funeral Home, Thursday, 21 November 1974 at 2:00 with the Rev. David Campbell officiating.

Mr. Jared, a resident of Rt. 1 Baxter, died November 20 in the local hospital following an extended illness. He was a native of Putnam County, the son of the late Isaac and Maggie Stone Jared.

He had been self-employed, operated Jared Monument Works since 1902 until his retirement. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Nettie Leftwich Jared; a son, Wilson Jared, Cookeville; 2 granddaughters, Donna Jean Jared, Cleveland, OH and Ann Wilson Jared, Nashville.

Burial was in Cookeville City Cemetery.

Mrs. Jared, daughter of Mrs. Albert Stanton (Fanny Jared) and the late Mr. Stanton of Baxter, Rt. 1, died at her home in the Gentry community of this county, Wednesday morning following an illness of many weeks.

In addition to her husband and mother, Mrs. Jared is survived by an only son, Pvt. Wilson Jared, who is on foreign duty; a granddaughter, Dona Jean Jared of Rockwood; a sister, Mrs. Henry Bockman of Buffalo Valley, and 4 brothers, Mizel Stanton, Virgil Stanton of Gentry, F. D. Stanton of Cookeville and Garland Stanton of Akron, OH.
