

MILDRED ALICE (ADAMS) JARED OBT.

Mrs. Alice Adams Jared, age 93, one of the oldest best known and most highly esteemed women of this county, died Sunday morning at the home of her daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. E.(lijah) M.(anon) DuBois, on Peachtree Street.

Mrs. Jared was the widow of the late Rev. William Wade Jared, a well known Methodist minister who served pastorates in Tennessee, Missouri, and Kansas Conferences. His death occurred about 45 years ago.

Mrs. Jared was born and reared in Macon County. She had resided in Putnam County since the death of her husband.

She had been a devoted member of the Methodist Church since her girlhood.

She is survived by her daughter Mrs. Veda Jared DuBois and by several grandchildren and great-grandchildren. A son, Prof C.(omer) Y.(oung) Jared of Madison, died a few years ago.

Funeral services were conducted Monday afternoon in the Chapel of the Whitson Funeral Home by the Rev. D. A. Ensor. Burial was in the City Cemetery.
