Eleanor McAllister Hall Obt.

Eleanor McAllister Hall was born 24 May 1910 in Kanab, Kane Co., Utah to Richard Samuel and Ida Young McAllister.

Eleanor passed away peacefully in her sleep, on 17 Nov. 2000.

When her older sister, Luetta, was killed in a car collision near Rawlins, Carbon Co., Wyoming, in 1933. Eleanor was on hand to care for her two young orphan, nephews, Howard and Charles, in St. George, Utah, while her brother-in-law, Vern Hall, returned to his employment in Crook Co. Wyoming. Vern, being a wise judge of women, saw in this relationship a prize-winning combination and proposed that Eleanor become his second wife. During her life, "Aunt Eleanor," as she was affectionately called by her 100+ nieces and nephews and many adopted daughters and sons, created a welcoming home at the Hall House. She was perpetually a teacher of Genealogy, where ever she lived, especially while on a mission for the LDS Church, with her eternal companion, in Pennsylvania, during the Bicentennial year. She gained some renown, nationwide, as a researcher and compiler of Family History books, which will be displayed at her funeral. In her final days, Eleanor's first question, when visited, was; "Well, how is all the family?" We have all learned from her example of faith and fortitude.

She is preceded in death by 11 siblings; her husband, Vern and son, Howard; and a great-grandson, Benjamin Johnson. She is survived by a sister, Nettie; a brother, Mark; a son, Charles; two daughters-in-law, Raona and Frankie; 14 grandchildren; 44 great-grandchildren; and one great-great grandchild.

Her funeral will be held at noon, Monday, 20 Nov. 2000 in Cottonwood 10th Ward Chapel, 4930 S. Westmoor (two blocks west of Cottonwood Mall in Salt Lake County). Viewing will be held Sunday Evening 6-8 p.m. at the Cannon Mortuary 2500 E. Bengal Blvd. (7600 So.) and from 11-11:45 a.m. prior to the funeral at the 10th Ward Chapel.

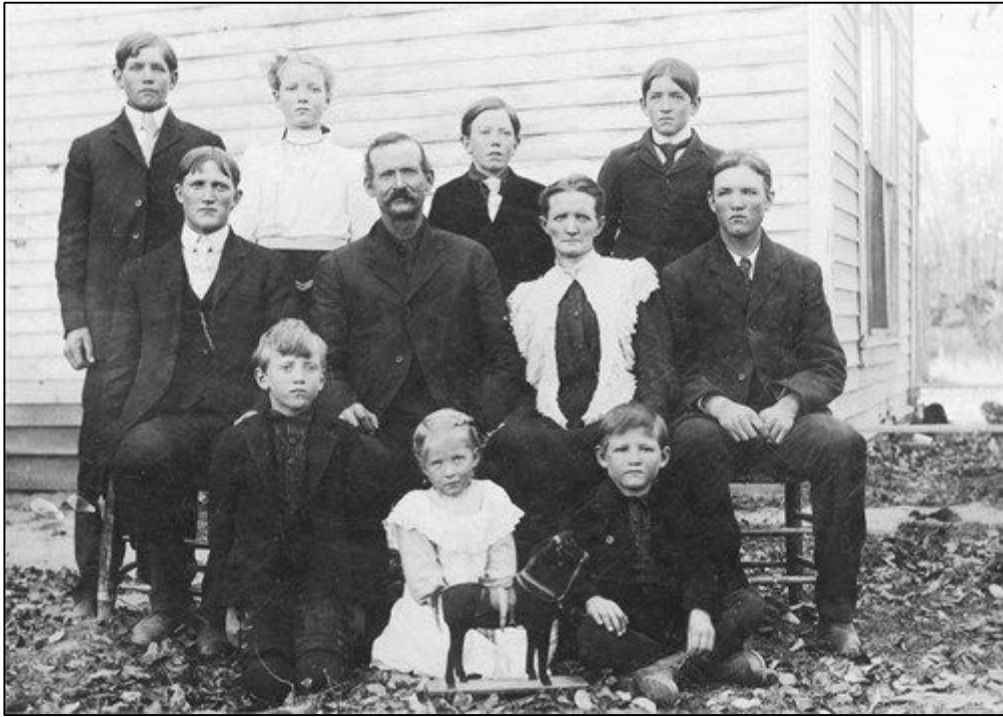

Eleanor McAlister Hall became Charles' mother when her older sister passed away at a very young age. Charles served a mission to Norway for the LDS church, and later in life a second mission with his dear wife to Brussels, Belgium. He gained bachelors and masters degrees from BYU in French and German. Charles later learned, Russian, Esperanto, some Dutch, Spanish and Turkish. He married Frankie Jane Taylor in the Salt Lake LDS temple on October 11th, 1957. Charles leaves a legacy of a brilliant mind, a desire to always be learning, and a love of all nations and people. He authored 10 books to help genealogists in the German and Prussian areas. He also founded two genealogical societies, Palatines to America and Federation of Eastern European Family History Societies.
