Mrs. Allison will be remembered as the former Miss Pearl Jernigan.

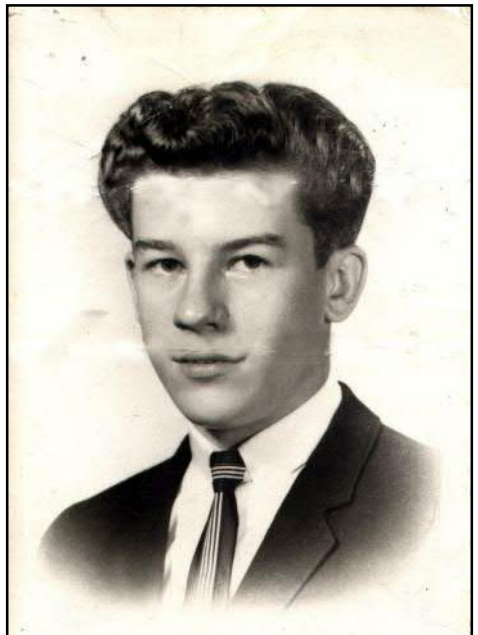

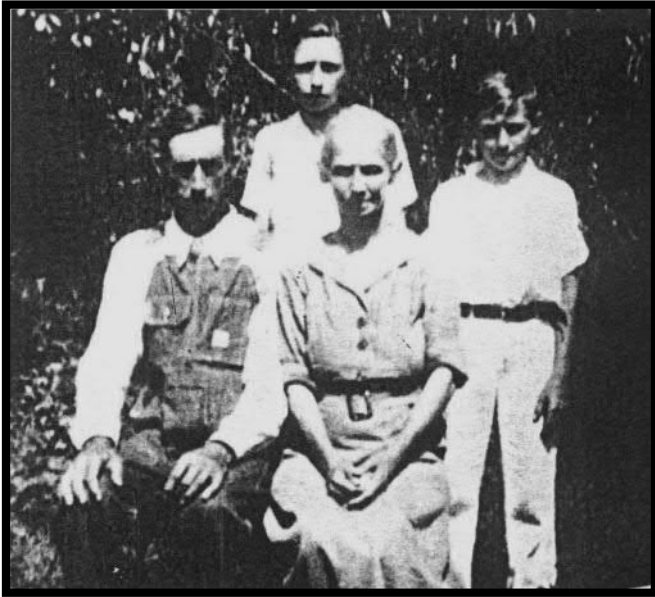

A Former Mobilian Finds New Life in An Old World

Eleven years ago, a young Mobil bride moved to Germany as wife of a German minister, to live and rear the children to be born of that marriage.

It was not a temporary military duty, as in the case of wives of armed forces personnel overseas, It was to be a new way of life within a new – but old-world. It was in a framework of a completely different culture, in the mingled cultures of Europe.

What has it been like? Was it a matter of remaining American in Germany, or of forsaking America to become German?

“It was neither,” said Mrs. Hans V. Nowak, the former Peggy Martin, now visiting in Mobile. “It has been an advantage to be able to combine the cultures of Europe and America.

“Our three boys, Martin, 10, Clifton 8, and John 5, read, write and speak German fluently.”

Their children go to German schools. How do German schools compare with American ones, in her opinion?

“In the lower grades, in Germany the children seem to progress more rapidly. They seem to learn to read and write much faster. But in the upper grades, I think I prefer the wider range of subjects offered in American schools.”

Mr. and Mrs. Nowak live in Kaiserslautern, in western Germany near the French border.

Her husband is a minister of the Church of Christ. He serves as pastor to a German speaking church and to an English speaking church, both mainly of military personnel.

There are approximately 75,000 Americans in Kaiserslautern, and some 80,000 Germans.

“It makes living a little different, with the two cultures having mingled since the war.

“My first barrier was that of language,” said Mrs. Nowak. “But that has been solved. And our children speak better German than I do.”

Next, there was the “formality of the German people in Kaiserslautern.”

“Here in the South, we’ve always been informal and casual, dropping in on a neighbor for a cup of coffee. There it is different. Invitations are issued, and received. It is very formal. No casual dropping in.”

In America, the custom seems to be “Live Now – Pay Later.” For the Nowaks, their new house situation was “Pay Now – Live Later.”

When she first arrived in Germany, Kaiserslautern was in a state of devastation from the war. “It was nearly 85 per cent destroyed, as it has always been a military installation.”

Now it is nearly completely rebuilt.

Mr. Nowak’s family of Czechoslovakia, had fled from their homeland on one of the last trains permitted out of the East from Czechoslovakia into the West in 1945. His family now lives in Frankfort Main, in West Germany.

“Our family is really international,” said for Mobilian, Mrs. Nowak.

“With NATO there, the French, English, German and American, I can’t really say we are American or German. He live in Germany. We are citizens of America. My husband became a naturalized citizen two years ago.”

A surprising – or is it surprising? – revelation came our about television and movies in Kaiserslautern, Germany.

“I am impressed,” said Mrs. Nowak. “TV and movies are more selective there for children. There are no adult programs on TV until after 8 p.m. and they frown on violence.”

On observing what children are permitted to see in movies and television in America, Mrs. Nowak said, “As a mother, I am impressed with what the German government is doing for children in this regard.”

Mrs. Nowak, who graduated from Murphy High School, is a former Azalea Trail Maid. She met her husband in college when he was a foreign student after he had already received his master's degree in Germany.

She and their children are visiting her parents, Mr. and Mrs. H.H. Martin of 3051 Farcott St. in Mobile, while her husband is lecturing throughout the United States. He will give a series of lectures at the Government Street Church of Christ next week.

They will return to Germany in December.

Two of John Tilford Jernigan's daughters wanted to go to a party in town. John didn't want them to go. When his two daughters asked him he said out loud, "Sure you girls can go to the party." Then he would whisper to his wife, Mahulda Jane Thompson Jernigan, "I don't want them to go to that party." Then he would say again "I don't care if you girls go to the party." Apparently he didn't want to be the fall guy when the girls were told that they couldn't go to the party. The blame was put on Mahulda when she had to tell them they couldn't go to the party.

According to family tradition, Mahulda Jane Thompson Jernigan called her husband by the name, Mr. Jernigan. One day Mahulda was frying up some chicken for dinner. John Tilford Jernigan her husband came in the kitchen and said, "I'm hungry what's for dinner." Mahulda said fried chicken, Mr. Jernigan. John said, "I'm hungry, lets eat." "The chicken isn't cooked enough yet, Mr. Jernigan, said Mahulda. "I don't care if it is cooked or not I'm hungry now give me that chicken cooked or not cooked." So Mahulda took the chicken out of the frying pan put it on a plate and gave it to him. John sat down and started to eat the chicken. He said, "This chicken isn't cooked enough." "I told you that Mr. Jernigan," said Mahulda. Then she put the chicken back in the frying pan to finish cooking it.

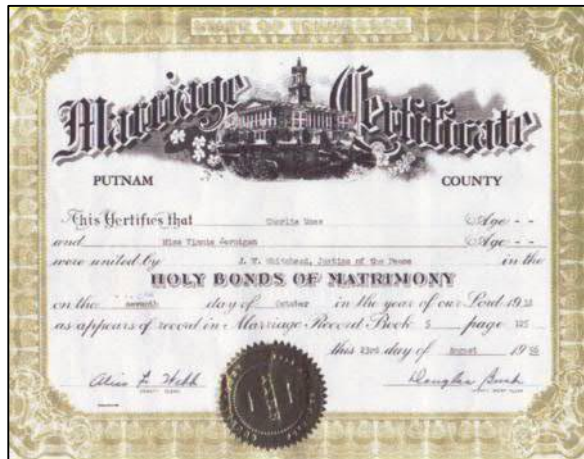

Pg. 9 & 10: Blackburn Springs/Double Springs: Running north of Baxter, Walton Road passed by Blackburn Springs (Double Springs). This significant site, now in Putnam County, was the first plantation west of the Cherokee Territory line. Benjamin Blackburn operated a stand and a post office in his home here during the first two decades of the nineteenth century. The French traveler Andre Michaux was impressed in 1802 with Blackburn's establishment, "the last that the whites posses on this side of the (Cherokee) line."³ Benjamin Blackburn, and Indian fighter since the 1880's, moved to Tennessee about 1790, claiming 1,132 acres awarded to him for participation in the 1787 expedition against the Chickamauga's. He built a large log house on the Roaring River, one and one-half stories high with "many rooms." He also helped build a log schoolhouse/church forty feet long and thirty feet wide; neither of these early buildings is extant.

In the 1820's Blackburn sold 640 acres to John Cummins, a mill builder/operator. Cummins built a one-story mill and house on Blackburn's Fork about 1825, and in 1845 he built a larger three-story mill farther downstream. There were two lathes-one for metal and one for wood on the ground floor-a grindstone on the second level, and a wool-carding machine and a cotton gin on the third floor. An attached sawmill was constructed behind the mill, forming the lower part of the L-shaped structure.
