The Anderson and the Austin families came into the beautiful green valley of the Lost Creek in southeastern White Co., TN in the early 1800's. \*Zachariah Anderson (1789 – 1867) was a pioneer landowner, farmer, stock-raiser, and a Two-See-in-the-Spirit Baptist preacher. Politically, he was a Whig. His wife, Rebecca (England) Anderson, was the daughter of Aaron England, who moved here from North Carolina and helped lay out the town of Sparta.

Their son \*John Milton Anderson (1815 – 1868) married Ann Eliza (Anderson) Anderson form Knox Co., TN (no relation). Among their children were: 1. Joel Tom Anderson, who married Elizabeth Austin, 2. Bob Anderson, 3. "Dutch" Anderson who married Elijah England, 4. Martha Anderson (1849 – 1927), who married William Bluford Austin (1847 – 1918); they moved to Texas and both are buried at Handley (near Fort Worth), Texas, 5. \*William Pleasant Anderson (1842 – 1889), a Baptist and a cobbler (made shoes) who served in the Army of TN during the Civil War and played the bugle for his company; married Mary Elizabeth Austin. (See below).

John and \*Nathaniel Austin were brothers who moved into Lost Creek in pioneer times. They and served other members of the Austin family are buried in the Austin Family Cemetery on the old plantation in the valley of the Lost Creek.

John Austin and his first wife, Rachel Denny Austin (d. 1818), were the parents of 1. William, (1803 - 1833), 2. Jude (1805 - 1825), 3. Tamsy, (1807 - ?) md a Haston, 4. Hannah (1809 - 1826), 5. James M. (1814 - 1889), 6. Elizabeth (1816?). After Rachel's death, John married Catherine Haston (d. 1843), and they had 8. Pleasant (1820 - 1900), 9. Emaline (1822 - ?) md a Doyle, 10. Robert (1826 - ?), 11. Susan (1829 - 1879) md a Duncan, 12. Daughter Bird (1831 - 1833), and tbl 13. William Edward (1833 - ?). John married  $3^{rd}$  Mary Ann Todd (1793 - 1864), but they had no children together.

Nathaniel Austin (1781 – 1869) and his wife \*Mary (1784 - 1870) also had a large family of children: I. Robert G. Anderson, b. 8 February 1865 – d. 22 October 1870, II. Martha Alice Anderson, b. 27 February 1874 --d. 8 June 1908, who md Emmett Rogers and had 1. Mamie, who md Robert Vance, 2. Herman, 3. Jim, 4. Charlie, & 5. Hayden Rogers. VII. James Monroe "Roe" Anderson, b. 18 February 1876 – d. 6 July 1957, who md 1<sup>st</sup> Eva Lance and had Irene who md Ridley Green; Roe md 2<sup>nd</sup> Emma Lance and had 2. Cordell and 3. Inez, who md Albert Fraser. Roe and his family lived on a hillside above Hickory Valley. VIII. Flora

Vergil Davis, 4. William Earl, 5. Johnnie Lee, who md Sadie Floyd, 6. James Monroe, who md Goldie Harris, 7. Matin, who md Zelma Rich, 8. Bonnie Vernon, who md Irene Simmons, 9. Mary Attie Anderson, b. 24 March 1884 – d. 27 February 1971, the baby of the family, who md W. E. "Uncle Ephraim" Davis (1867 -1962) and had 1. Jimmy, who md Fleeta Land in Texas, 2. Frank, who md Hazel Smith in Texas, 3. Edd, who md Geneva Sapp, 4. Mamie, 5. Alene, who md J. Austin Boyd 6. Leonard, who md Dorothy Peek, & 7. Flo, who md C.A. Roberts in Chattanooga, 3. Nathan Austin, d. 7 July 1854, at 4 years of age. Buried in Austin Family cemetery, 4. Isabelle, d. 27 August 1855, at 3 years of age. Buried in Austin Family cemetery. 5. Susan Austin, d. 7 September 1854, at 6 months of age. Buried in Austin Family cemetery, 6. James Monroe Austin (1857 - ?), who at age 18 killed Henry Green in self defense and left for the west, last being seen at his Uncle Raleigh Austin's home in Lead Hill, Arkansas, 7. Darthula "Thulie" Austin (c 1859 – 1940), who married a Mr. White and lived at Yankeetown, north of Sparta, TN, 8. Nancy Jane "Nan" Austin, who md a Mr. Dodson and lived in Hickory Valley, White Co., TN.
