In later years, his and his wife Susan's faith deepened as they attended the Algood Cumberland Presbyterian Church as well as Trinity Assembly. Though Mr. Maddux would not have wished those who love him to mourn him long, he will be profoundly missed.

In addition to his mother, his family includes his **wife of more than 25 years, Susan Brown Maddux** (whom he married Aug. 19, 1983, at Paran Methodist Church); his father-in-law, Fred Brown; a brother and sister-in-law, Ralph Grady and Kathy Maddux and their children, Rachael and Sarah; a sister and brother-in-law, Cathy and Johnny Jones and their son and daughter-in-law, Jeremy and Emily and their infant son, Jackson; a stepsister, Susan Maddux Jones and her daughters, Mollie and Erin; and innumerable loving family and friends.
