SILVER POINT WOMAN KILLED IN CYCLE CRASH

PUTNAM COUNTY -- A Silver Point woman was killed and her husband seriously injured in a motorcycle accident in Murfreesboro yesterday, according to reports from the Tennessee Highway Patrol.

Tommy W. Thomas, 62, and his wife, Jan Rice Thomas, 52, had gone for a Sunday ride on their motorcycle to enjoy the beautiful weather, friends said.

Just outside the Murfreesboro city limits, their Harley-Davidson cycle was hit by a car that pulled out in front of the cycle, according to the reports.

Jan Thomas was fatally injured, and Tommy Thomas suffered broken bones and other injuries. The driver of the car, Landon Thomas Mangrum, 20, of Rutherford County, was also injured in the crash.

Today, Tommy Thomas is being treated in Vanderbilt Hospital's trauma center, and several of his many friends from Cookeville have been there since he was admitted.

"He has broken vertebrae and broken ribs, but he is now stable," said his friend, Noel Cherry.

Taryn Bolton, another friend, said, "My husband, who is a doctor, was allowed to go in and see him last night, and he was talking. He said Jan was not just his wife, she was his best friend."

Tommy Thomas owns T .Thomas & Associates, a very successful construction/development firm here, and has designed and built many of the larger homes in this area, Cherry said.

"He designs beautiful houses, and he's known for that talent of design," Cherry said.

His wife, Jan, helped him in his business, and both were active in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Cherry said.

The couple are members of Collegeside Church of Christ, where many of their friends are also members.

"We have a group of couples in our church who go out for motorcycle rides together," Taryn Bolton said. "But yesterday, Tommy and Jan just went out on their own for a Sunday ride."

She said they were always a very happy couple.

"She was a wonderful person," Noel Cherry said.

Funeral arrangements for Mrs. Thomas were incomplete as of this morning.
