



Verse wrote in school days book belonging to Tim Denny written by Daisy Durno (Chambers) Bullington. Tim was the s/o Virgil Timothy & Audra Camilla (Anderson) Denny. This was when Tim went to Denny's Seminary in Buffalo Valley, TN near his home. The school land was donated by his grandfather, Timothy Denny the school was built by the family so the community had a school for the children to attend. Tim Denny boarded at Daisy Durno & John Wesley Bullington's house in Lebanon, TN while Tim attended Lebanon High School in 1941. Daisy wrote in Tim Denny's Lebanon High School Yearbook, "Be sure to have a cane when you aim at a Mazda." Daisy and John Wesley were both school teachers. I was told by their son Charles Rhea Bullington that he owns a diary handwritten by Daisy Durno (Chambers) Bullington about her daily life in Tennessee.



The Nashville National Cemetery is located about six miles north of downtown, on Gallatin Road in Madison a short distance north of the Briley Parkway interchange. The 65.5-acre cemetery contains 33,258 interments, as of October 1997 (the cemetery is now in closed status).

#### **HISTORY OF THE CEMETERY**

This hallowed ground was established as a U.S. Military Cemetery on Jan. 28, 1867. The Louisville & Nashville Railroad runs through the cemetery, dividing it into two nearly equal halves. The stone wall around the cemetery and the limestone archway at the front entrance were constructed in 1870. Among other outbuildings and structures, a speaker's rostrum was completed in 1940.

Roll of Honor, No. XXII, dated July 31, 1869, submitted to Quartermaster General's Office, U.S.A., Washington, D.C., recorded the graves of 16,485 Union soldiers interred in the national cemetery at Nashville, Tennessee and remains as a part of the cemetery's historical records.

Originally there were 16,489 interments (burials) of known soldiers and employees: 38 were officers, 10,300 were white soldiers, 1,447 were colored soldiers, and 703 were employees.

Among the unknown, there were 3,098 white soldiers, 463 colored soldiers and 29 employees. The deceased had been gathered from an extensive region of Middle Tennessee and southern Kentucky. The number of distinct burial places from which these bodies were taken is 251.

A very large proportion of the dead in the cemetery, however, were transferred from the hospital burial grounds in and around the city of Nashville and from temporary burial grounds around general hospitals in Nashville and nearby battlefields of Franklin and Gallatin, Tenn. Reinterments were also made from Bowling Green and Cave City, Ky.

During the Civil War, if marked at all, wooden headboards with the names and identifying data painted thereon marked graves of those who died in general hospitals, on the battlefields, or as prisoners of war. Many of these headboards deteriorated through exposure to the elements. The result was that when the remains were later removed for burial to a national cemetery, identifications could not be established, and the gravesites were marked as unknown.

#### **NOTABLE MONUMENTS, MARKERS:**

\* One of the oldest private markers in the cemetery is a spire located in Section M, Grave 16234, which was dedicated to the memory of James A. Leonard of the 1st Kansas Battery. He was killed by guerillas on Jan. 23, 1864 and interred on Jan. 27, 1864.

\* In 1920, the State of Minnesota erected a monument in Section MM inscribed, "In memory of her soldiers here buried who lost their lives in the service of the United States in war for Preservation of the Union--AD 1861-1865."

\* Chaplain Erastus M. Cravath, 101st Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry, was interred in Section MM, Grave 16694, in 1900. Chaplain Cravath was one of the founders of Fisk University in Nashville, and served for 25 years as its president.

\* Colonel James W. Lawless, 5th Kentucky Cavalry, was buried in Section MM, Grave 10662, on June 25, 1899. Col. Lawless was born in Ireland and came to the United States at the age of 16.

- Colonel Edward S. Jones, Commander of the 3rd Pennsylvania Cavalry, was also the founder of the Department of Tennessee and Georgia Grand Army of the Republic and served as Commander for many years. He was interred in Section MM, Grave 16520, in Nov. 1866.

Audrey Roseborough was a seamstress known for her unusual creativity and versatility. She created wedding gowns, prom dresses, christening dresses, tailored clothes, overcoats, costumes for plays at Stetson's Stover Theatre and, perhaps above all, hundreds of smocked dresses and dolls' dresses for lucky little girls all over the world.

A faithful member of First Presbyterian Church in DeLand, Audrey Roseborough, together with a small crew, cooked innumerable suppers for the men of the church over many years.

During World War II, she took her only job outside her home, working in a glider factory in DeLand while her son was serving as a glider pilot in Europe.

After she turned fifty, "Granny R." began to travel extensively outside the United States, visiting her children in far-flung places, and flying for the first time in her life alone to Europe. With her husband, she circled the globe twice on freighters, visiting Africa, Asia, and South America. Travel thrilled her, a small-town Tennessee girl who as a child had never dreamed of leaving the state.

Back at home, she reveled in the extraordinary beauty of Florida. She often reminisced about old DeLand history, and remembered well both the heroic and the ugly events in the city's past. Late in life, her beloved neighbor Ann Magaha persuaded her to join the National League of American Pen Women, and she flourished in that lively company. Through her long and beautiful life she retained a strong interest in politics, proudly displaying photos of Democratic presidents and candidates, and cherishing her birthday greetings from Presidents Carter, Clinton, and Barack Obama. Her friendships nonetheless transcended differences in politics, economic status, race, religion, and age, so that her circle of friends remained strong and faithful. Her own family was united by love and admiration for her, and family members traveled from great distances to visit with her, not from feelings of obligation, but for their own delight.

When she was eight-eight years old, "Granny" began losing her vision, and with it some of her most cherished pleasures: travel, reading, sewing, and riding her bicycle all over town. She continued to enjoy each day, however, and especially the frequent visits from family, friends, and total strangers. Through all her life, she was a good neighbor. Shortly after her hundredth birthday, she fell and broke a hip, but was walking again in just a few weeks, savoring life and announcing that she had never dreamed she'd be so happy at such an age.

For five years, much of her comfort depended on the loving care of Abigail Walker Hill, a native of Jamaica. More recently, she was cared for by wonderful women from Haiti, Jamaica, and the United States. Their patience, kindness, and goodness kept her comfortable and contented despite her declining health.

In 1921, a story from the Nashville Banner announced Audrey's marriage to "Capt. R.W. Roseborough," then a teacher at Castle Heights Military Academy in Lebanon, Tennessee. The reporter wrote that the bride had "many hundred friends" who had "been attracted to her by her unusual attractiveness and splendid disposition."




