I, Jehue Meadors Sen: of the County of Cumberland do make & publish this my last will and testament. I give to my daughter, Frances Meadors, one negroe man by the name of Harry to her and her heirs forever. I give to my granddaughter Mary Boatright my negroe girl by the name of Corsey and should my granddaughter die? leaving issue of her body it is my will that the said negroe Corsey and her issue shall return to my estate & be equally divided among my six children or their heirs (to wit) Anne Robinson, Patty Anderson, Sally Boatright, Joseph Meadors, Jehue Meadors and Frances Meadors. I give to my grandson Jehue Meadors, the son of Jonas Meador the sum of sixty pounds to be raised from my estate for the purpose of educating him. It is my will that the rest of my estate consisting of Dicke, Suke, Hannah, Old Delphia, my stock of cattle, horses, hogs, sheep, plantation utencils, & the interest I have in the negroes I bought of my son Jonas which he held in the right of his wife Polly who was Polly Robinson, be equally divided among my six children (to wit) Anne Robinson, Polly Anderson, Sally Boatright, Jehue Meadors, Joseph Meadors, & Franky Meadors, subjecting the said estate first to the payment of such debts as may be proper to be paid & the legacy of sixty pounds which is left to my grandson Juhue Meadors the son of Jonas. Lastly, I appoint my friends, Richard Anderson, Willis Wilson & John Hatcher my executors. As Witness my hand and seal this 10th of February 1808.

#5464 Israel Jared – (Joel 2, John 1) born 5 March 1807, Bedford Co., VA – d. 6 January 1892, age 85 years, at Jasper County, Illinois. He was the son of Joel and Polly (Dowell) Jared – md Rhoda Meador – b. 22 January 1808, Hardenburg, Breckenridge, Kentucky – d. 1 August 1874, Jasper Co., Illinois. Married 2nd 13 January 1876, Sarah J. Brown.

Israel Jared, the son of Joel and Polly (Dowell) Jared, was born near Sinking Creek, Breckenridge Co., KY. He married 27 February 1837, Rhoda Meador. In the fall of 1845 they migrated to Jasper Co., IL with his father, Joel, and his brother William. They had ten children at that time.

Rhoda Meador, wife of Israel Jared, was born in Virginia 22 January 1808. The Meadors are an old English family dating back to Wystensham, Norfolk Co., 1188. In 1636 one Ambrose Meador received a grant of land in Isle of Wight Co., Virginia and in 1638 Nicholas and John Meador also came to America and settled in Virginia. Their coat of arms bears the inscription "Mea dod Virtus" which means "Virtue is my dowry." This well applied to slender courageous Rhoda Meador Jared.

Pg. 7: While the majority of the sons of Jonas & Frances were too old to serve in the Rev'l forces, the youngest Jesse, served both in the State Militia & on "The Committee of Saftery." Several of the other brothers are recorded as having furnished supplies to the American forces and a number of their sons served in the Virginia militia.

Pg: 9: Their oldest son Joel of Bedford Co. (later Franklin) was a Justice of the Peace in 1770. At least three of his sons were Rev'l War Veterans. He died November 1798 leaving 166T acres to eight sons. The three sons in the Rev'l War are Jonas, Joel Jr. & Isham, and are in the National Archives & Court Records of Smith Co., TN.
