Burton had on a channel that was airing the soap opera called, Stella Dallas but Betty Jo Maxwell wanted to change the channel. When they started talking loud about what channel to listen to, Essie Avo (Jernigan) Loftis took Audrey Burton home.

Later that day it was said that Mahulda Jane (Thompson) Jernigan ate an orange. laid down and died.
