
Ida Louis Campbell Author of 'Oh, Strange New World" - 1986

Herein, Ida Campbell, historian and author, has produced a book descriptive of bygone eras, that is both entertaining and enlightening.

The history of her own forefathers is vividly chronicled, but her narrative base is much broader.

She records stories of Indian encounters, cattle rustlers and backgrounds of the immigrants to this area.

Turn-of-the century social life of a small town is highlighted and portions of the book are devoted to medicinal cures and family recipes.

About the Author: Ida Campbell

Although *Oh*, *Strange New World* is Ida Campbell's first published work, she has kept personal journals for years, recording events and registering her reactions and feelings. A course in creative writing at Southern Methodist University, in her younger years, gave direction to her writing efforts.

She is more than the "historian" of her family. She has been influential in the restoration, preservation and marking of historic sites and buildings in Bee County and was one of those persons responsible for the restoration of the McClanahan House in Beeville, the town's first mercantile establishment. The McClanahan House is now a museum, furnished with period pieces and reflecting the history of the area. The Junior Service League of Beeville has had an important role in the restoration and maintenance of this historic building.

Ida Campbell is a charter member of the Been County Historical Commission and served as president for seven years during the 1960's. She continues to serve on the committee

responsible for the upkeep of Evergreen Cemetery which dates back to the founding of Beeville in 1859.


