
Bethel Robinson Prichard Obt. Herald Citizen – Cookeville, TN

Bethel Robinson Prichard led a very interesting life style. He was a vegetarian most of his life. Probably in his late 20's he joined a group of five men who formed a religious group calling themselves Israelites. The men grew long beards and hair. They never went to cemeteries. They would say, "Let the dead bury the dead". They believed they would never die. Bethel Robinson was the last member of this group to die. He was 100 yrs. old on his last birthday in 2002. He has a 95 yr. old sister still living in 2002 and had a 90 yr. old brother who recently died ca. 2002.
